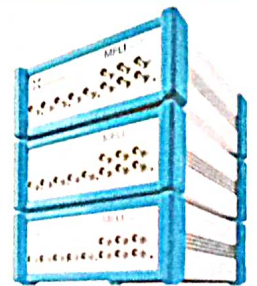

Abstract. $\text{CuZnFe}_2\text{O}_4$ and $\text{CoZnFe}_2\text{O}_4$ Nanocomposite were synthesized by solution combustion method and synthesized powder were characterized by X-Ray diffraction (XRD), Fourier transform infrared spectroscopy (FT-IR) and Thermal Properties (DSC/TGA). The XRD results confirm the cubic spinel structure of the ferrites and crystalline size (D) found the range of 40-50nm. The FTIR measurement between 400 – 4000 cm^{-1} confirm the absorption bands in the Spectrum. The thermal properties such as onset of decomposition and glass transition temperatures were determined by Thermo Gravimetric Analysis (TGA/DSC). The TGA data shows that Nanoferrites have significantly enhanced thermal stability. Thermal studies on as prepared samples have been undertaken over a wide range of decomposition at room temperature to up to 1000°C.

INTRODUCTION

Nanotechnology, shortened to "nanotech", is the study of the controlling of matter on an atomic and molecular scale. Generally nanotechnology deals with structures of the size 100 nanometers or smaller in at least one dimension, and involves developing materials or devices within that size. Nanotechnology is very diverse, ranging from extensions of conventional device physics to completely new approaches based upon molecular self-assembly, from developing new materials with dimensions on the nanoscale to investigating whether we can directly control matter on the atomic scale. Nanotechnology has the potential to create many new materials and devices with a vast range of applications, such as in medicine, electronics and energy production. On the other hand, nanotechnology raises many of the same issues as with any introduction of new technology, including concerns about the toxicity and environmental impact of nanomaterials and their potential effects on global economics [1]. Materials reduced to the nanoscale can show different properties compared to what they exhibit on a macroscale, enabling unique applications. For instance, opaque substances become transparent (copper); stable materials turn combustible (aluminum); insoluble materials become soluble (gold). A material such as gold, which is chemically inert at normal scales, can serve as a potent chemical catalyst at nanoscales. Much of the fascination with nanotechnology stems from these quantum and surface phenomena that matter exhibits at the nanoscale.

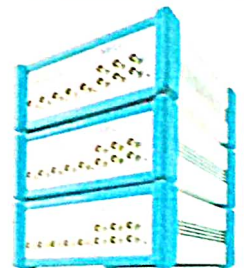

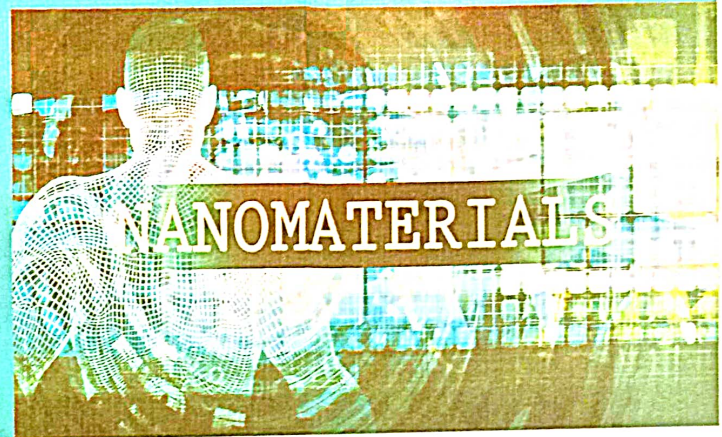
Abstract. The Response of Polyvinyl Alcohol (PVA)/ Zinc Oxide (ZnO) based on Polymer composite films. Polymer films of were prepared by solution casting technique at room temperature. Characterized by different characterization techniques by XRD, FTIR, UV– visible spectroscopy, and Mechanical Properties. Also, we had studied the optical properties of PVA/ZnO composites based on ZnO as inorganic filler material and PVA as the main matrix. The prepared samples were determined by UV-Visible Spectrophotometer (UV-Vis), XRD, Morphology and universal Testing Machine (UTM) to study the optical and Mechanical Properties. The crystal structure and crystallinity of polymer composites were studied by XRD. The recorded spectra of UV-Visible absorption and Transmission spectra have been used to determine the optical band gap (E_g) of PVA/ZnO thin films. Reduction in optical band gap and increase in optical band gap with increase in concentration were observed. It is also found that there is an increase in dielectric constant with increase in photon energy. The obtained results reveal that the refractive index of the PVA/ZnO films may be efficiently changed.

INTRODUCTION

Polymer is a subject of considerable research due to their ability to combine the advantages of both polymers and filler components. There are several applications of polymeric nanocomposites based on their optical, electrical, mechanical and magnetic properties [1, 2]. Polymeric ZnO nanocomposite materials have attracted large interest. In particular, ZnO filler into polymeric matrices can modify the optical, electrical and mechanical properties [3–5]. Poly(vinyl alcohol) (PVA) is a semi crystalline, water-soluble polymer, and has excellent film forming and adhesive properties making it have several interesting Physical properties, which are very useful in technological, pharmaceutical and biomedical applications [6–9]. ZnO is one of the most important wideband gap materials (3.22 eV, at 300 K) and has superior electronic and optical properties. As a low cost II–VI semiconductor which is environmentally friendly, its promising applications in short-wavelength light-emitting, transparent conductors, dye-sensitized solar cells, piezoelectric materials, gas sensors varistors and fully transparent thin film transistor have initiated intensive research [10]. Several physical and chemical methods have been used for the fabrication of ZnO nanostructures. The aims of the present study are to investigate the mechanical and optical properties of ZnO/PVA thin films with different concentrations of nano ZnO were prepared using easy and low cost solution casting method. The prepared samples were characterized by XRD, FTIR, UTM and UV– visible spectroscopy. Also, we had studied the optical properties of ZnO/ PVA films. The absorption spectra of ZnO/PVA composites films, respectively, were recorded in the UV/visible region while optical properties were examined.

Introduction

Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar is known as the father of Indian constitution as he was the most draftsman of Indian constitution which was adopted on 26th November 1949 and got implemented on 26th January 1950. Because of his noteworthy works and contributions in the various fields he is also known as a great leader of freedom movement, a high-caliber lawyer, a great dalit leader and a distinguished economist. Babasaheb was a highly intellectual person of his time. He was the first person to pursue PhD in economics from abroad. He was the first South Asian to have double doctorate degree in economics from London School of Economics and Columbia University. With such a strong background in economics still Babasaheb contributions in the field of economics are not so popular. The possible reason may be that his extraordinary work in sociology, law, religion and politics has overshadowed his contributions in economics. But this does not mean that his contributions in economics were diminished. The important contributions of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar in the form of thesis, dissertations and papers are "The present problem of Indian Currency", "The Problem of Rupee: Its Origin and Its Solution", "Ancient India and Commerce", "The Evolution of Provincial Finance in British India: A Study in the Provincial Centralization of Imperial Finance", "Administration and Finance of the East India Company", "Small Holdings in India and their remedies". The Department of Education, Government of Maharashtra has published many speeches and writings of Babasaheb in several volumes.

Dr. Ambedkar as a Nation builder

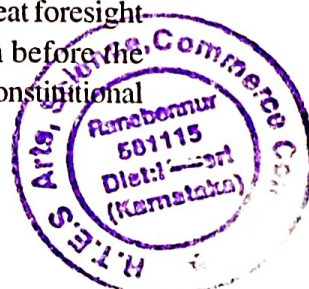

The freedom of a Country does not usually mean the freedom of the people in that country. The influence and the power of the state may be concentrated in a particular class of people. Before the promulgation of the Indian Constitution, the concept of the status of a particular class of people was based on birth and not on the capabilities and caliber of the people. The very vitals of the Indian social life had been eaten by religious dogmas and society was based on graded inequality.

Dr. Ambedkar was chairman of the drafting committee that was constituted by the Constituent Assembly in 1947 to draft a constitution for the independent India. The definitions of democracy given by Walter Bagehot or Abraham Lincoln were not satisfactory to Dr. Ambedkar. Bagehot defines democracy as "government by discussion" and Lincoln as "A government of the people, by the people, and for the people." By "democracy" Ambedkar refers to fundamental changes in the social and economic life of the people and the acceptance of those changes by the people without resorting to disputes and bloodshed. He desired to remove contradiction created by economic and social inequalities. He wanted to establish the principle of one man, one vote, and one vote one value not only in the political life of India but also in social and economic life. He said, "We must make our political democracy a social democracy as well. Political democracy cannot last unless there lies at the base of it social democracy." Dr. Ambedkar's whole life is the continuous, unending courageous struggle he had to make against social injustice, inhuman, unequal treatment. Dr. Ambedkar's was, par excellence, a spokesperson of the ignored community, i.e. the workers, small peasants, landless laborers, and women. So it is pertinent to raise some question
